The dances become more and more virtuosic with time. Ballet used to lack of diversity, until a few decades ago, where people from other races and ethnicities, such as African American Ballet dancers decided to challenge the conservative traditions of Ballet. Today, Misty Copeland, is one of the world most famous dancer, and is the first African American Soloist in the history of the American Ballet Theater. Ballet also changed with time in regard to the aesthetics, stories, gender, and sexuality. More and more men wear point shoes and "tutus", and ballet is now more open to different body types and phenotypes than it used to be.

Origins of Hip-Hop:

70s/80s Bronx, Queen, Manhattan, NY City. African American and Puerto Rican teenagers created this culture but developed considerably in disco and funk clubs, as well as in the streets of New York in response to socio-political and socio-cultural struggles after the Civil Rights Movements.



Characteristic of Hip-Hop:

4 Elements: DJing, Emceeing, Breakdancing, Graffiti

Style, Authenticity, Naming, Identity are very important in Hip-Hop. The original Hip-Hop dance genres are: Breakdancing a.k.a bboying/bgirling, popping, locking, voguing.

Hip- Hop Today:

Although Hip-Hop was a site-specific culture (African Americans-Puerto Ricans in NY from the 70/80s), Hip-Hop developed rapidly as it is a culture that speak to youths across the globe, and we can almost call Hip-Hop a Universal Culture today. In Hip-Hop Dance, many sub-genres emerged such as New Style, Girly Style, House etc. but breakdancing remains one of the main popular dance.
