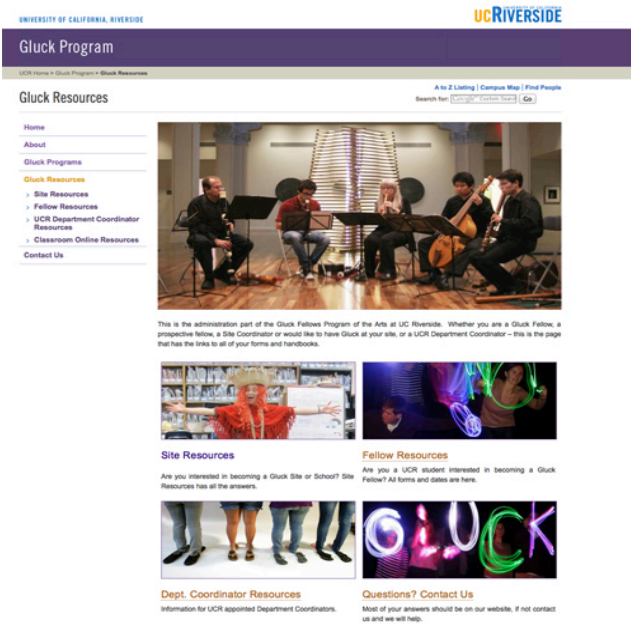


Gluck Fellows Program at UCR in Focus: Winter 2015

The Gluck Fellows Program of the Arts at UCR has introduced new, improved web-features to improve access to its programs and educational opportunities



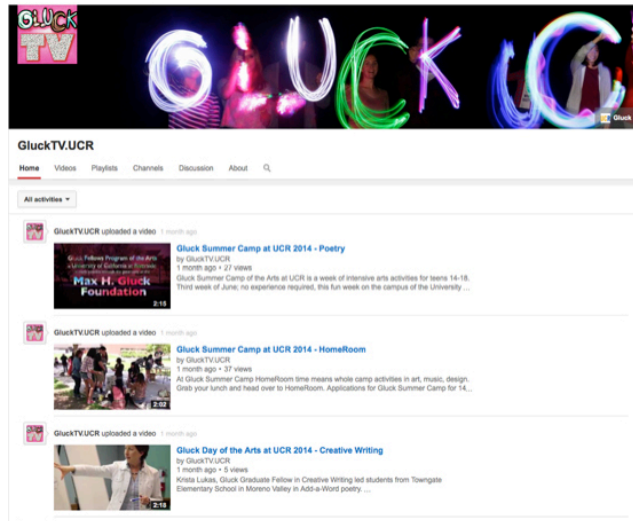
New Website

Gluck Fellows prepare a Classroom Online Resource Document with their projects. These resources are for educators to use to extend learning, or inform classes about various arts subjects.

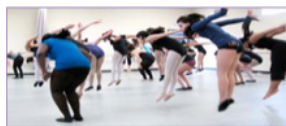
The files in this section are Public Domain and free for you to download, and to use for educational purposes.
