





## The Vihuela

- One of the earliest known forms of the guitar. Dates from around 1500.
- Looks like the guitar but is much smaller.
- The strings were tuned in courses (pairs) to increase sound and the tuning was different.
- Was used to play solo or to accompany singers or other instruments.

## **Baroque Guitar**



- Very similar to the vihuela, dates from the 1600s.
- Still very small in size, but they added the sound hole.
- Strings were also tuned in pairs, but the notes (tuning) were different.
- More ornamented, used mostly to accompany singers, storytellers and other musicians but can also be played solo.

## **The Romantic Guitar**



- Looks more like the modern guitar, but still smaller. Dates from the 1800s.
- Single strings! Tuned in the same way than the modern guitar.
- Often used to accompany singers but more frequently used to play solos.
- Very ornamented designs. Lots of decoration!

## **The modern Classical Guitar**



- The modern guitar dates from the late 1800s around 1890.
- Bigger in size and sound.
- Strings used to be made from animal intestines, before the invention of nylon which replaced them around 1945.
- Parts of the guitar are described like the human body: head, neck and body.
- Used to play solo, accompany singers or instruments and later in bands.
- Guitarists often borrow music from other instruments for performance, because the guitar has not been around as long.
